

Gone, but not forgotten

Ghosts of Gone Birds - an unprecedented exhibition of original art, writing and music opens today in the East End of London. Among more than 120 artists producing new work for this innovative show are Sir Peter Blake, Ralph Steadman, Margaret Atwood, Desmond Morris, Jamie Hewlett, Rob Ryan, Kai & Sunny, Charming Baker, Polly Morgan, Marcus Coates and Billy Childish. Each artist has been invited to choose an extinct bird and breath life back into it through their creativity. The result is an extraordinary living body of work that celebrates the spirits of those species now lost and acts as a powerful 'call to arms' to help raise awareness for the BirdLife Preventing Extinctions Programme and support the BirdLife Partnership in its quest to avoid further extinctions.

Dr. Marco Lambertini, Chief Executive of BirdLife International, said, "In modern times, species are going extinct at least a thousand times the natural background rate. Many more are so threatened that they are on the verge of disappearing and urgent action is needed. *Ghosts of Gone Birds* is a provocative new way to reach out and inspire a wide audience about today's extinction crisis and mobilise action to rescue the species at risk today. There is still hope and the BirdLife Partnership has shown that, with the right resources and targeted action, species can be saved. Perhaps unsurprisingly, better known avian extinctions such as Dodo, Great Auk and Passenger Pigeon feature in several of the artists' work but many lesser known extinct birds, with equally extraordinary back stories, like [Stephens Island Wren](#), [Laughing Owl](#) and [Lord Howe Gerygone](#) are also remembered.
