1. Project Management – Seabird and Turtle Bycatch Project
 - Manage the overall implementation of partner activities in all target fisheries and countries within the region, and support Bycatch Instructors staff within the seabird and turtle bycatch project and deliver reports to the Donor
 - Ensure the timely delivery of project activities, and efficient management of budgets, with a particular emphasis on providing adequate support to the bycatch instructors and partners to ensure, as far as possible, the delivery of good outcomes by each partner/for each activity
 - Assist in developing relationships with partners to deliver value for money in all contractual relationships
 - Explore new collaboration / partners to achieve objectives on the bycatch work in West Africa
 - Work with project partners and West Africa Marine Programme Coordinator to raise awareness on seabird and turtle bycatch within the West African region
 - Develop communication content on partners’ activities including stories and policy briefs to ensure that information and new knowledge is shared with the relevant stakeholders including policy makers, non-state actors among others
 - Work with the bycatch project partners to implement relevant bycatch mitigation trials, through early establishment of collaborations with industry, government, academia and other civil society entities
 - Ensure capacity building and effective communication within the sector to underpin a social understanding of the need to prevent bycatch, which includes rolling out EAF training across the sector
2. Capacity development in project management
 - Support capacity development of BirdLife partners in bycatch mitigation
3. Fundraising
 - Assist in funding opportunities to sustain bycatch work in West Africa, especially beyond 2022, but to also ensure that co-funding opportunities are raised
 - Facilitate and coordinate Phase II proposal for the bycatch project
